

Re-examining the status of Logic in the Psychology of Reasoning

Abstract: This poster focusses on the role of logic in theories of reasoning, with particular attention for the status of logic in the field of psychology of reasoning.

Much recent reasoning research has downplayed the usefulness of logic in understanding reasoning behaviour, primarily because of the many negative findings in the field regarding our ability to reason logically. But I will argue that such negative findings have been based on a simplistic understanding of the relation between meaning and logic, which plays out in assumptions about the logical form of reasoning premises. Insights from formal semantics and philosophy of language regarding the nature of linguistic meaning help to resolve this misunderstanding and allow us to reassess the logicity in subjects reasoning. I illustrate this with the case of research on reasoning with quantifiers. Finally, I highlight the relevance of this topic for other areas in the cognitive sciences.
